The Loss of HMCS Skeena; Chapter 13 LEST WE FORGET

Between the 21st and the 27th of October 2019, the cadets of 116 Royal Canadian Sea Cadet Corps "Skeena", travelled to Iceland to commemorate the 75th Anniversary of the loss of their namesake HMCS Skeena. HMCS Skeena was lost on the evening and early morning of 24-25 Oct 1944, wrecked in a fierce North Atlantic storm, as the ship was wrecked on the rocky shore of Videy Island. 15 members of her crew perished.

On the morning of the 25th, it was a rather cold and windy day. Not much different than the morning of 75 years earlier when the survivors of HMCS Skeena made their trek across Videy island Iceland to be rescued. Although cold and wet, our cadets did not complain. It was almost fate (or faith as some may describe it), that what we were experiencing with the weather that morning added to commemoration and remembrance of the loss of our shipmates.

After a luncheon hosted by the family of the Icelandic fisherman, <u>Einar Sigurdsson</u>, who coordinated and lead the rescue mission on behalf of the Royal Navy, the cadets and officers traveled to Fossvogur Cemetery in Reykjavik to conduct Remembrance Services in Commemoration of the loss of HMCS Skeena.

I have been to the cemetery 3 times before, the last being in 2006 Fossvogur cemetery is the main cemetery for the city, hence you can imagine the size and the area it covers. It is a very unique place to visit and its upkeep is impressive. With Iceland being very barren of trees and such, the cemetery is a vast area of green shrubs and trees. Very much different from other places around the city. It is a very welcoming place with asphalted path ways throughout the cemetery, and you see many locals walking within its confines. Within the cemetery is a small plot containing about 200 graves of various nationalities and faiths of soldiers/airman/army personnel/merchant seaman who perished during WW2. This area is maintained by the commonwealth graves commission, and buried in this section are 14 of the 15 boys from HMCS Skeena. In the centre of the plot, is a large cross of sacrifice, very similar to our own cenotaph in Victoria Park.

The cadets gathered around each of the 14 graves and last post was played by one of the cadets. A poem was read by one of the cadets and the act of remembrance performed. We were also joined by the Sigurdsson Family and the Canadian Ambassador to Iceland. Cadets laid a special commemoration plaque at each head stone and an additional plaque was laid on the cross of sacrifice for the missing 15th sailor. Here we were, standing in front of the head-stones on the 25th of October 2019, each headstone engraved HMCS Skeena 25 October 1944. Although our service was simple and short, what better tribute to the lives of our shipmates than to be here exactly on the 75th anniversary.

After the service our cadets were led on a short 5-minute walk down a path to the resting place of Captain Einar Sigurdsson. So, fitting his final resting place is close by the crew of HMCS Skeena. As we are standing there, the cadets began removing their red poppies from their uniforms. They did so with out being told to, it just happened. The Sigurdsson family stood in silent, watching the cadets pay their respects in their own way. As we left for the bus, so was left a sea of red poppies on the headstone. A simple gesture, but an amazing tribute to man who saved so many lives.

In 1944 Einar Sigurdsson was awarded and made a member of British Medal. His OBE is displayed proudly in the offices of the family fishing company in Reykjavik. Although mentioned in official Canadian records, he was never formally recognised for his gallantry by the Royal Canadian Navy or the Canadian Government. I truly believe the actions of the cadets speak for themselves and their tribute of leaving their poppies is more fitting then any certificate or medal can do.

As legion members we often repeat those words, Lest We Forget, however that on that day, 25th of October, 2019, the cadets of 116 RCSCC Skeena, not only learnt what those words meant, but also took it upon themselves to put those words into actions.
