SGT AT ARMS REPORT

OCTOBER 2024

September has seen the pace picking up. On September 7 th I attended the Veterans Service Officer

training at the Peterborough Legion along with our President and comrades Don Ramsey and John Aikens. The following day we were in Peterborough again for the Poppy seminar.

At short notice the President and myself attended a service for the Battle of Britain held at the Cobourg Cenotaph on September 15th. This was organized by the Air Cadets and attended by all the Cadet Corps. A very well organized and executed service.

The Branch General meeting was held on Thursday 19 with our Colour Party in attendance. On Saturday 22 September I attended the Sgt at Arms training in Bewdley. This was followed by our

annual Drumhead Service outside the Bewdley Legion.

The Drumhead service is a tradition going back to the 1700's. When the troops were in the field there was no church or chapel available. The practice was for the Band to march up and pile their drums. The Colours (flags) were then marched up and placed on the drums. The padre would conduct the service using the piled drums as a makeshift altar. Upon completion the colours were collected by the Colour Party and the drums recovered by the drummers.

Upon completion of the Drumhead service, we all headed straight back to Cobourg for the celebration of life for comrade Don Ashfield who was a former member of the Colour party and also the commander.

I am looking for members who would like to be part of our Colour Party. Training will be provided. The Colour Party is an icon of the Royal Canadian Legion and takes part in events such as Canada Day parade, Remembrance Day and the Christmas Parade.

If you are concerned with the cost, you can sometimes find donated blazers on the coat rack. If not, the Charity stores will have them as well as grey flannels for a fraction of the price of a new one. Berets, badges etc. can be purchased from the Branch kit shop.

Zone - Half the entry fee


District - Entry fee
