Cobourg Legion Pipes and Drums

Missile Missive October 23, 2024

November is always the most important month of the year for the Pipes and Drums of the Legion. It is the month in which we join with the nation and its citizens to recognize our veterans, and serving members of our Armed Forces. These are sacred opportunities which we embrace. The first such appearance-in-support is on Sunday, November 10, for the Alderville First Nation Remembrance Day Service, starting at 1:00pm at the Alderville First Nation Cenotaph. Unveiled in 1927, the first of its kind in Canada to recognize the services of indigenous peoples in the First World War, the Cenotaph continues to be not only a symbol of those sacrifices, but also an active site of recognition of those from the Alderville community who also served in WWII, Korea and Viet Nam.

November 11 and the band will parade with Legion members through the town, arriving at the Cobourg Cenotaph for the 11am Remembrance Day Service. The Cobourg Cenotaph was first unveiled in November 1924, by Effie Bolster, a Cobourg nurse who served overseas during WWI. The monument was rebuilt in 1990 and stands as a proud symbol of the recognition of Cobourg area service women and men, who served their country in the Second Boer War, WWI, WWII, the Korean War, Viet Nam, Afghanistan, and in Peacekeeping duties. Your Pipes and Drums are proud to represent the Cobourg Legion on this very important day. Following the service, we will again this year carry the message of Remembrance to several area schools and long-term care facilities.

The balance of the month of November will be taken up with Christmas Parades in a number of area towns - Brighton, evening of Nov. 15, Newcastle, late afternoon of Nov. 17, Colborne, evening of Nov. 23, Frankford, afternoon of Nov. 30, and concluding with Cobourg on the evening of the same day. Challenging though it is to play the pipes and drums during this time of year, we are also committed to bringing the joy of our music to our community.


