Padre November report written November 11<sup>th</sup>, 2024.

"LET THERE BE PEACE ON EARTH" TODAY, THE 11TH IS A REMINDER - WAVES OF WAR.

Can you recall a time in your life when the world was at peace? Not likely, depending on your age or where you lived, you will know of wars going on! "Conflict took place in every year of the 20th Century; the world was free from the violence caused by war for only very short periods of time. It has been estimated that 187 million people died as a result of war from 1900 to the now. The actual number is likely far higher."

This tradition we commemorate today was originally about Nov 11, 1918, the day the armistice was signed bringing end to WW1, at the 11<sup>th</sup> hour of the 11<sup>th</sup> day on the 11<sup>th</sup> month

This war deprived many of our Grandparents, many of whom perished 1900-1918. During the years between the world wars, there was a Russian civil war which raged from 1917 -1922. An Irish war of independence which was immediately followed by the Irish civil war lasted until 1923. Spanish civil war 1936 -1939

Many of us living today have real life memories of WW2. If you hail from Europe or the UK, your memories are probably quite vivid, our families and those of allied forces were literally decimated.

What is the spiritual component here? Chaplains are included among our armed forces personnel which indicates recognition that there is a spiritual dynamic. The supreme solution to war, is for humanity to return to God and live in peace together. In the Christian scriptures, there are many references to peace!
