WHAT CAN WE DO?

Some good wishes are in order as we go to press this month. Summer will be upon us, so May you have a wonderful time of summer activities. I also want to extend my congratulations to our new executive, that you may have a very successful term. Thanks to all who have stepped up to serve. As you see from my article title, my theme is what can WE do.? That's my Segway to tell you about a few highlights from the Royal Canadian Legion 53rd Biennial Provincial convention, recently held in London Ontario. 478 registered delegates attended the four-day event. If you would like to observe and learn the of your Legion, attending a convention, district or provincial is something YOU CAN DO. Here are some biographical excerpts:

LAWRENCE CHRISTENSON::

Lawrence served 28 years in the Canadian military, with several deployments in the middle east, Africa and SE Asia. Lawrence also represented us as a member of Team Canada at the 2019 Warrior Games in Florida. Lawrence has embraced a number of different strategies to assist him in his PTSD journey; including working with horses and dogs. Lawrence has been a PTSD Service Dog handler and advocate for 11 years and was proud to walk beside National Service Dogs; Lynx for 9 years and today is partnered with National Service Dogs' Roxy thanks to the generous support of the Ontario Command of the Royal Canadian Legion in partnership with Wounded Warriors Canada.

Lawrence told us; Service dogs enabled him to "get his life back". Lawrence's story gives us pause to ponder; what CAN WE DO? Following his presentation, checks amounting to \$94.000.00 were collected. Over Two million dollars has been raised for this program to date.

One of the checks was presented by Nash. Nash first saw a service dog when he was six years old. He researched them on the internet and set about raising funds by auction sales and various means. Nash is now eight years old and the check he presented was for \$13.000.00 To date he has raised \$25.000.00. Gives us pause to wonder WHAT CAN WE DO?

MICHAEL TRAUNER:

Mike Trauner served in the military for almost 19 years as an infantry soldier, Paratrooper, LAV Crew Commander, Section Commander, and Instructor at the Third Battalion Royal Canadian Regiment at CFB Petawawa and has served in Bosnia and Afghanistan. While on deployment to Afghanistan 2008, MCpl Trauner stepped on a roadside bomb resulting in the loss of both his legs, three fractures to his left arm and twenty-five breaks to his left hand, multiple burns, he had his right thumb reattached and suffered nerve damage throughout his body and even had fragments of shrapnel imbedded in his eyes.

MCpl Trauner required 18 major surgeries, 18 blood transfusions. He died twice from his wounds and had to be placed on life support to keep him stable and alive. Mike and his wife Leah spent 14 months at the Ottawa Rehabilitation Center learning to walk and live again. After only 69 days Mike took his first steps and shortly after completed the 5km Army Run despite being told he may never walk again.

Mike represented Team Canada at the September 2017 Invictus Games in Toronto after being challenged by Prince Harry to join Team Canada. He competed in both Rowing and Cycling, winning Canada double gold medals which were presented to him by Prince Harry.

Mike has earned the Medal Of Valour for heroism while in Afghanistan, presented to him by the Governor General, the Sacrifice Medal for the loss of limb and life, "I have served my country with great pride and distinction over the past 19 years. My goal is to carry on that tradition and wear the Canadian flag once more, to inspire pride in others and to prove that a disability does not define you". "One Inspires Many"

If one was not moved by Mike standing at the podium, telling his story, then I don't know what would move that person.

Gives us pause... WHAT CAN WE DO?

Then there was the senior attendant at the convention, Una. Una is ninety-nine years young, and she is planning to be in Winnipeg next year for the dominion convention celebrating The 100th Legion anniversary.

Everything we do as Legion members is ultimately to support these heroes and their loved once.

Please consider WHAT YOU CAN DO.
